Full Spectrum of Cinema Highlights the 46th Ann Arbor Film Festival

Ann Arbor, March 19th, 2008 – The 46th Ann Arbor Film Festival, taking place March 25 – 30th, is gearing up for a week-long showcase of cutting-edge, inspiring, visionary and timely programs. More than 40 programs will showcase new work from filmmakers, performers and artists from 20 countries this year.

Renown for avant-garde films that provoke, challenge and inspire audiences, the AAFF is once again providing a strong offering. Pip Chodorov's *Faux Mouvements (Wrong Moves)* makes its U.S. premiere in the [Cracking the Space/Time Continuum](#) program of perception-shifting experimental films. Sandra Gibson and Luis Recoder also strike light to celluloid with their innovative [live projector performance](#). On Sunday the festival presents Nathaniel Dorsky's sublime silent films with [Devotional Songs](#).

This year's festival will also feature special programs, exploring the earth and its colorful inhabitants. Films from the [Live Earth](#) series address the climate change crisis and provides inspiration for taking action. Jim Trainor presents [The Animals and Their Limitations](#), a dark and humorous program of his remarkable animated films. Debra Miller returns for another edition of short films for "Out Night" at the AAFF with [Queer Realities: Fact and Fiction!](#)

Also slated for the festival are Mitch Levine of The Film Festival Group, Christopher Holland of B-Side Entertainment, and Bob Alexander of IndiePix for an intensive short film distribution panel titled [Multiplying Eyes](#). The AAFF is also excited to have Chris Gore of Film Threat return to host [Flipping the Coin](#), a provocative panel about the battle over copyright and fair use rights for filmmakers; panelists include Emily Berger of the Electronic Frontier Foundation. Exploring the mind-bending side of this year's time-based theme, film professor Dan Herbert will present a lecture [A Brief History of Time Travel in Cinema](#).
